Why Should I Enrol?

This is the only Certificate IV in Work Health Safety (WHS) program that has been developed specifically for people who work within a health environment.

Not only will you gain a Nationally Recognised qualification but you will also be supported in developing core WHS knowledge and skills. The workplace project undertaken by participants provides an opportunity for practical application of skills and participation in positive workplace change.

Completion of this qualification can be mapped to the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards 1.1-1.5, 1.12-1.14, 13.1, 13.3, 13.4, 15.1, 15.5.

Target Audience:

We are looking for participants who have an interest in WHS and recognise the importance of contributing to a safe environment for our workers, patients, families and visitors.

If you are interested in a career in WHS, this qualification may assist with gaining an entry level WHS position.

Participant Requirements:

You will be required to complete nine face-to-face workshops as part of this program. These sessions will all be held at the CEWD Rozelle Campus.

All participants will be expected to complete a workplace WHS project that has been endorsed by both your local WHS Manager and line manager.

Units covered in the Program:

- Assist with compliance with WHS laws
- Contribute to implementing & maintaining WHS consultation and participating processes
- Contribute to WHS hazard identification, risk assessment and risk control
- Contribute to implementing and maintaining WHS management systems
- Assist with responding to incidents
- Make a presentation
- Undertake project work
- Contribute to work related WHS measures & initiatives
- Ensure workplace emergency prevention procedures, systems and processes are implemented
- Implement continuous improvement

Support Provided to Participants:

All SLHD participants will be provided with support from the program coordinator and local WHS Managers. This will include workplace visits and project review meetings.

Application Process:

There is a three staged application process for SLHD employees:

1. Apply for the program via the LMS
2. Complete the EOI form and send to the program coordinator
3. Attend a Language Literacy and Numeracy Assessment

Applications Close: 15 June 2018

Program commences: 24 July 2018
