DIAGNOSIS: LIVER – CARDIAC CIRRHOSIS

CLINICAL HISTORY: M/88. This patient had suffered for a long time from cardiac failure resulting from coronary artery disease and old myocardial infarction.

MACROSCOPIC: The lobular architecture of the cut surface of the liver is markedly accentuated, more so than in chronic venous congestion of lesser duration. The capsular surface is finely granular and is likened to morocco leather.

MICROSCOPIC: The centrilobular hepatocytes have undergone atrophy and have been replaced by fibrous tissue, with linkage of one hepatic vein to another. The portal tracts are not involved. Histiocytes packed with golden brown lipofuscin pigment are prominent. (right image).
