**DIAGNOSIS:** SMALL BOWEL – GALL STONE ILEUS WITH PERFORATION.

**CLINICAL HISTORY:** F/88. There had been two previous hospital admissions for acute cholecystitis and on the second occasion a large calcified gall stone was demonstrated, The inflammation resolved with conservative treatment. Two weeks after the second discharge the patient was readmitted for haematemesis. Vomiting supervened and at laparotomy the ileum was found to be perforated and a segment of small bowel was resected.

**MACROSCOPIC:** This is a length of small bowel at the centre of which is a large deeply pigmented gall stone obstructing the lumen. The gut proximal to the stone is congested and mildly dilated, whilst the distal portion is normal. On the reverse side , the gut wall is attenuated over the gall stone an has ruptured at this point.
