DIAGNOSIS: PENIS – SQUAMOUS CELL CARCINOMA

CLINICAL HISTORY: M/57. The patient had a lesion on the foreskin for one month. A biopsy showed squamous cell carcinoma. Amputation of the penis and perineal urethrostomy was performed. There was subsequent lymph node involvement, leading to bilateral inguinal node dissection.

MACROSCOPIC: The specimen consists of the distal 8cm of the penis. There is a fungating tumour bulging out beneath the prepuce. The cut surface shows whitish tumour tissue involving the glans penis.

MICROSCOPIC: Sections of the tumour show an invasive squamous cell carcinoma with the adjacent normal epidermis (left image). The tumour is poorly differentiated with area of necrosis (right image).
