DIAGNOSIS: LUNG - LYMPHOMA (MARGINAL B-CELL)

CLINICAL HISTORY: M/69. A symptomless hilar shadow was discovered on a routine chest X-ray. It was thought to be a carcinoma, and lobectomy was performed. There is no record of disease elsewhere in the body.

MACROSCOPIC: There is an indistinct pale area fanning out from the hilum of the lung into the contiguous pulmonary parenchyma.

MICROSCOPIC: The neoplasm is made up of small lymphoid cells forming no particular pattern, but at the advancing edge the neoplastic cells take on a distinct perivascular distribution (left image). There is focal infiltration of the bronchial epithelium (right image), forming lymphoepithelial lesions.
