**DIAGNOSIS:** KIDNEY - CASEOUS TUBERCULOSIS & PYONEPHROSIS

**CLINICAL HISTORY:** M/58. There are no available details except that a left nephrectomy was performed.

**MACROSCOPIC:** The main body of the pelvis is not itself enlarged, but on cross-section it can be seen to communicate with what looks like enormously dilated calyces. This appearance has resulted from caseous destruction of the renal substance and its consequent discharge into the pelvis. Flakes of this caseation are still to be seen adhering to the walls of the cavities.

**MICROSCOPIC:** There was no evidence of activity of the infective process but calcification (dark staining) and dense fibrosis are depicted here.
